Dear Mr. Nidel:

This letter is submitted on behalf of my client, North Texas Municipal Water District (NTMWD) in response to your letter dated January 31, 2019. NTMWD is committed to providing a safe drinking water to the communities it serves and ensuring that those communities have accurate information regarding the water they drink. NTMWD's drinking water currently complies with all state and federal regulations. NTMWD has earned recognition from the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) as a Superior Public Water System.

During the past several months, NTMWD has worked with its member and customer cities to develop new resources, beyond those currently required by regulators, as well as informative materials regarding the upcoming annual one-month change in disinfectant scheduled for March 4 to April 1. These resources are located on the NTMWD website at: [www.NTMWD.com](http://www.NTMWD.com).

Beginning in December 2018, NTMWD initiated monthly tests for levels of Disinfection By-Products (DBPs) in its system, which will continue during the next annual maintenance period (March 4 to April 1). NTMWD is posting the results of these tests online at [www.NTMWD.com/water-testing/](http://www.NTMWD.com/water-testing/) as soon as those results are available. This testing is in addition to the testing conducted by the TCEQ and our member and customer cities. Over 300 samples of NTMWD water are tested for DBPs each year within NTMWD's member and customer city systems. The test results reflect that NTMWD's drinking water complies with all state and federal regulations.

If your client Safer Water, North Texas has any additional questions or suggestions for changes to the state and federal safe drinking water regulations that NTMWD complies with, they should be directed to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) or TCEQ, the regulatory agencies that govern those standards.
